literate adult performers who had already mastered the grammatical arts from the late thirteenth century on however the attention and resources of both lay and clerical patrons came to be devoted specifically to young boys centering on their function as choristers because choristers needed to be trained before they received instruction in grammar the liturgical skills of reading and singing took on a different meaning this shift in priorities zieman argues is paradigmatic of broader cultural changes in which increased interest in liturgical performance and varying definitions attached to reading and singing caused these practices to take on a life of their own unyoked from their original institutional settings of monastery and cathedral unmoored from the context of the choral community reading and singing developed into discrete portable skills that could be put to use in a number of contexts sacred and secular latin and vernacular ultimately they would be carried into a wider public sphere where they would be transformed into public modes of discourse appropriated by vernacular writers such as geoffrey chaucer and william langland during the winter of 1972 a woman spends a single night with a young chilean poet before he departs new york leaving her his desk it is the only time they ever meet two years later he is arrested by pinochet s secret police and never seen again across the ocean in the leafy suburbs of london a man caring for his dying wife discovers a lock of hair among her papers that unravels a terrible secret in jerusalem an antiques dealer has spent a lifetime reassembling his father s study plundered by the nazis from budapest in 1944 now only one item remains to be found connecting these lives is a desk of many drawers that exerts a power over those who possess it or give it away and as the narrators of great house make their confessions this desk comes finally to stand for all that has been taken from them and all that binds them to what has disappeared great house is a story haunted by questions what do we pass on to our children and how do they absorb our dreams and

illustrates that underneath walsers literary production there is a cognitive process that is marked by the psychological concepts of hyperreflexivity and a loss of common sense the author address four primary elements of walsers writing including his flâneur texts his singular prose moments of stasis and epiphany in his writing and the sense of psychological jeopardy that appears repeatedly in his writing this study proposes a new aetiology for walsers prose one rooted in uncommon cognition at the same time it offers a bridge between two trends in walsers scholarship one which has focused on his hospitalization and diagnosis of schizophrenia and another that has stressed his unique literary style death is a whisper in the anglo saxon world but on a remote island off the coast of county mayo it has a louder voice the local radio station runs a thrice daily roll call of the recently departed the islanders keep vigil with the corpse and share in the sorrow of the bereaved the living and the dead are bound together in the oldest rite of humanity in my fathers wake kevin toolis gives an intimate eye witness account of the death and wake of his father celebrating the spiritual depth of the irish wake and asking if we too can find a better way to deal with our mortality by living and loving in the acceptance of death robin birdy perry a new army recruit from harlem isnt quite sure why he joined the army but hes sure where hes headed iraq birdy and the others in the civilian affairs battalion are supposed to help secure and stabilize the country and successfully interact with the iraqi people officially the code name for their maneuvers is operation iraqi freedom but the young men and women in the ca unit have a simpler name for it war mooring is one of the most complex and dangerous operations for ship and terminal crew if something goes wrong the consequences can be severe effective mooring gives crew a general introduction to mooring and guidance on how to stay safe during mooring operations it is written in an easy to understand style for seafarers worldwide and can be used as a training guide for both new and

experienced crew produced by the oil companies international marine forum ocimf the book is written for crew on board oil tankers barges and terminals but the principles can be applied to any vessel i loved the ballast seed i couldn't put it down beautiful and sad and hopeful all at once luminous and lush full of dirt darkness sun light and soft new growth it's a story of vulnerability persistence and the will to live this is a memoir that will make you weep then roll up your sleeves and plant the seeds of a new life cal flyn author of islands of abandonment the surprise of a second pregnancy so soon after the birth of her first son plunged rosie into a despair that spiralled into deep depression terrified at the prospect of adding another child into her already precariously balanced life rosie was compelled to find a new way of living she found herself instinctively drawn to the local parks and scraps of communal green spaces in her local south east london neighbourhood and to therapy via tending a hidden garden deep within the city interlaced with her responses to the travel journals of an eccentric 19th century female botanist and adventurer rosie elegantly describes how these pockets of nature amidst the urban sprawl provided just enough to mend her broken spirit
