changed his name and turned his life around but when he bets on the monthly poker game it looks like his luck has just run out or has it dr jennifer bingham has done everything right her whole life starting in high school when she tried to help a cute guy everyone else thought was a loser and now thanks to the mess her twin sister has made of her life jennifer is raising her niece sami when bad boy beckett shows up to clean her house using a different name now she tries to forget how he snubbed her years ago but because of her ex husband s lies the fallout from her sister s mistakes and the mystery of who might have fathered her niece jennifer isn t leaving anything up to chance until sami runs away to find her dad and beckett antes up his support his truth and his love that s a bet jennifer s willing to take it s clara who s desperate to enter the labyrinth and it s clara who s bright strong and fearless enough to take on any challenge it s no surprise when she s chosen but so is the girl who has always lived in her shadow together they enter within minutes they are torn apart forever now the girl who has never left the city walls must fight to survive in a living nightmare where one false turn with who to trust means a certain dead end a lively story of raising a child to enjoy real food in a processed world and the importance of maintaining healthy food cultures why is it so easy to find su gary cereals and dinosaur shaped chicken nuggets in a grocery store but so hard to shop for nutritious simple food for our children if you ve ever wondered this you re not alone but it might surprise you to learn that this isn t just an american problem packaged snacks and junk foods are displacing natural home cooked meals throughout the world even in italy a place we tend to associate with a healthy mediterranean diet italian children traditionally sat at the table with the adults and ate everything from anchovies to artichokes parents passed a love of seasonal regional foods down to their children and this generational appreciation of good food turned italy into the world culinary capital we ve come to know today when jeannie marshall moved from canada to rome she found the healthy food culture she expected however she was also amazed to find processed foods aggressively advertised and junk food on every corner while determined to raise her son on a traditional italian diet marshall sets out to discover how even a food tradition as entrenched as italy s can be greatly eroded or even lost in a single generation she takes readers on a journey through the processed food and marketing industries that are re manufacturing our children s diets while also celebrating the pleasures of real food as she walks us through roman street markets gathering local ingredients from farmers and butchers at once an exploration of the us food industry s global reach and a story of finding the best way to feed her child the lost art of feeding kids examines not only the role that big food companies play in forming children s tastes and the impact that has on their health but also how parents and communities can push back to create a culture that puts our kids health and happiness ahead of the interests of the food industry no one grows up saying i think ill get sick and spends the rest of their life trying to survive a constant battle between life and death instead we grow up believing were invincible we believe nothing bad could ever happen to us because we have hopes and dreams to fulfill theres never a good time to have poor health in 2002 my husband juan contracted valley fever which disseminated into fungal meningitis causing irreparable scarring on his brain for nine years our time was primarily focused on my husbands illness and disability our three children lived with the uncertainty of their fathers mortality as a family we learned to live as if each day was the last but to have hope for the future we made memories and made plans there were times we didnt know if we could survive but as a family we found the strength in god to stay together we were blessed with many tender mercies from the lord as we traveled what appeared to be an endless road we understood that even though our trials seemed long they were merely a short segment of mortality and that our lives will continue to exist beyond the grave most importantly we learned that love heals all and serving one another is truly a blessing for ourselves as a married couple juan and i witnessed countless miracles touch our lives as we exercised faith for enduring the end
