by nadine gordimer these pieces are meditations which echo that which was has been and is the writer mahfouz they are in the words of the title of one of the prose pieces the dialogue of the late afternoon of his life i don t believe any autobiography with its inevitable implication of self presentation could have matched what we have here with more than 500 000 copies of his books in print naguib mahfouz has established a following of readers for whom echoes of an autobiography provides a unique opportunity to catch an intimate glimpse into the life and mind of this magnificent storyteller here in

his first work of nonfiction ever to be published in the united states mahfouz considers the myriad perplexities of existence including preoccupations with old age death and life s transitory nature a surprising and delightful departure from his bestselling and much loved fiction this unusual and thoughtful book is breathtaking evidence of the fact that naguib mahfouz is not only a storyteller of the first order vanity fair but also a profound thinker of the first order the autobiography of giambattista vico is significant both as a source of insight into the influences on the eighteenth century philosopher

s intellectual development and as one of the earliest and most sophisticated examples of philosophical autobiography referring to himself in the third person vico records the course of his life and the influence that various thinkers had on the development of concepts central to his mature work beyond its relevance to the development of the new science the autobiography is also of interest for the light it sheds on italian culture in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries still regarded by many as the best english language translation of this classic work the
